NURSSERY TEACHERS REPORT

In St. John ECDE centre we have 5 teachers. These are Madam Phyllis, Norah, Penina, Riziki and Elizabeth. We normally cooperate and work together in all activities eg exchanging ideas, developing materials, taking care of the children to make sure that the children are developing holistically. We have a roll of 91 children as from baby class up to kg3. In baby class we have 20 children

age 2½ upto 4 years, kg1 19 children age 4-5 years kg2, 22 children 5 – 6 years kg3 29 children age 6 to 7 years.

These children are very social in such a way that they play together and associate with all teachers. We teachers having been working together to make sure that the centre is doing well. Our mission are {1} nurturing children from tender ages from 2 years to improve the enrolment of the children in the centre {2} introducing P.E kits for the children to maintain cleanliness and to wear them during occasion {3} we are also introduce graduation ceremony for transition class from nursery to primary level. {4} we also have plan to have a van in future whereby we shall get more children from far places. Most parents like to bring their children to our centre but they are worried about the safety of their children e.g. crossing roads and kidnapping on the way.

Through the learning materials you have donated to us Shonda, Kenya it has motivated our pupils. Because children learn through observing. Imitating and playing.

Especially the small balls that are there level. Not heavy than their weight it allows them to develop eye hand coordination as they throw and wait to catch it. Hence able to develop both fine and gross muscles.

Through playing snake and ladder game they achieve the knowledge of reorganization of a snake and its functions. Eg where a snake swallow and remove as waste products. It also encourages language acquisition skills eg jumping and holding the rope.



The school has provided us with learning materials e.g. storybooks and textbooks. We are working extra hard to pass in our national examinations at the end of the year.


Note: our school motto is -strive to excel. In our school we have been blessed with electricity and clean water. The electricity helps us to extend our studies in the evenings.
