What is the Shonda Project?

The Shonda Project is a small independent charity which has helped provide Kenyan children with affordable primary education for 20 years. There are currently over 350 pupils in St John's School, which is situated in the small community of Shonda, on the outskirts of Mombasa. The Shonda Project currently provides over 85% of the money to run, maintain and develop the school.

What are Shonda Gift Cards?

Shonda Gift Cards are an alternative approach to gift-giving. It works like this: ...You buy a gift card for £5 or £10 ... your friend or relative receives the card with details of exactly what the money is being allocated towards...then the Shonda Project uses your money to buy books, medicines etc for use in Shonda, Kenya.

Can my money really make a difference?

To put it in perspective the average teacher salary is about £90 a month, so £5 or £10 in Kenya will go a lot further than here in the UK.

What has happened to the money raised last year?

Last year over £900 was generously given through the sale of Gift Cards. Here are three examples of how your money was used to help children in Shonda.



1. Medicines, continue to help in combating fever and treating small cuts.



2. Feeding programme. Providing a simple meal makes a daily difference to many pupils



3. Nursery equipment. New toys were purchased with donations given




Basic medicines make a difference! - £5
